

# Open Salts made by Guernsey Glass Co.

The Guernsey Glass Company was started by Herold Bennett and his two brothers in 1967 where they made their own glass, then in the late 1970's they stopped making their own glass and had items made from their molds which they sold in their showroom. They did not have any items made for a few years and were selling off items in inventory. However, in 1999 some of the family decided to rejuvenate the business and had some items made. As of 2001 molds were disposed of and acquired by others as indicated.

Marks used were B in Triangle or a capital B.

## Guernsey Glass Item Heavy Press Salt Dip (Original Mold) (Mold acquired by Look in the Attic Co)

**Reference:** H&J 914      **Size:** 1 3/4" Dia, 1" High

**Remarks:** Copy of Duncan Miller Quarter Block, also called Teutonic. Marked with B laying along bottom edge. Many probably lost during fire polishing.



**Colors:** Made in multiples of colors that would be almost impossible to identify as one tank could produce multiple variations of the slag colors in addition to standard colors. Many colors currently available.

## Guernsey Glass Item Heavy Press w/Flange Rim Salt Dip (Original Mold) (Mold acquired by Look in the Attic Co)

**Reference:** H&J 913      **Size:** 1 7/8" Dia, 1 1/4" High

**Remarks:** This resulted in making of Teutonic Block when the wrong cap ring was used on the mold.



**Colors:** Made in multiples of colors that would be almost impossible to identify as one tank could produce multiple variations of the slag colors in addition to standard colors.

## Guernsey Glass Item Footed Salt Dip (Original Mold) (Mold acquired by Look in the Attic Co)

**Reference:** H&J 915      **Size:** 1 5/8" Dia, 7/8" High

**Remarks:** Also called Caprice Pattern. This was never made old. Many found have Guernsey B on inside of one foot.

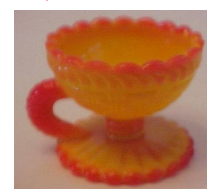


**Colors:** Made in multiples of colors that would be almost impossible to identify as one tank could produce multiple variations of the slag colors in addition to standard colors. Many colors currently available.

## Guernsey Glass Item Handled Salt Dip (Old Atterbury Basket Mold) (Mold acquired by Look in the Attic Co)

**Reference:** H&J 4482      **Size:** 1 3/4" Dia, 2" across handle, 1 3/8" High

**Remarks:** Old Atterbury mold but has Guernsey B in Triangle in bottom.



**Colors:** Green, Pink, Yellow, Lt Blue, Cobalt, Green Milk, Orange Sunkist, Roseline (All in Satin) Vaseline, Sea Foam

## Guernsey Glass Item Squirrel and Stump Salt (Mold acquired by Wilkerson Glass)

**Reference:** H&J 929      **Size:** 3" Long, 1 7/8" Wide, 2 1/4" High

**Remarks:** Most marked with Guernsey B on left side of squirrel on bottom edge of stump



**Colors:** Amber, Dark Amber Blue Milk, Crystal,

## Guernsey Glass Item Small Slipper (Mold acquired by Wilkerson Glass)

**Reference:** H&J 841      **Size:** 3 1/8" Long, 1 1/8" Wide, 1 5/8" High

**Remarks:** Unknown Mold. Marked with Guernsey B in Triangle inside heel.



**Colors:** Orange Sunkist, Cobalt, Green Milk, Amber, Blue, Current Vaseline, Sea Foam
